**REQUEST FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST (REOI) FOR THE HIRING OF A
CONSULTANT TO DEVELOP CURRICULUM FOR NURSING AND MIDWIFERY
COMPETENCY SKILL TRAINING**

The Government of the Republic of Liberia has received financing from the World Bank in support of the Institutional Foundations to Improve Services for Health (IFISH) and intends to apply part of the proceeds to hire an experienced Consultant to Develop Curriculum for Nursing and Midwifery Competency Skill Training.

The objective of the assignment is to develop a national standardized comprehensive curriculum for the provision of in-service training for nurses and midwives in pediatrics, obstetrics, and critical care. This will include stakeholders' consultations and consensus with the Liberia Board of Nursing and Midwifery and Ministry of Health and relevant partners on the development of the in-service curriculum, review the current training packages in country and being used by other stakeholders, develop and validate standardized curriculum complete with participant handbook, workbook, and facilitator guide, create a roadmap for the implementation of the in-service training curricula which will be developed.

Qualifications and Experience

The Curriculum Development Consultant must have the following minimum educational and professional qualifications and experience:

- The consultant should be a Medical Practitioner with Masters in Public Health or Nursing or Medical Education, or Education and experienced in curriculum development. PhD is an added advantage.
- Must possess interdisciplinary knowledge and should have a proven expertise in public health, Nursing. Must understand the Liberian context with minimum of 10 years' experience in the field.
- Existing experience in developing training manuals, In-service training curriculum
- Excellent written and oral skills in ENGLISH
- Good meeting facilitation skills

Responsibilities: The Consultant will be expected to perform the following tasks during the contract period, detailed of which can be obtained from the Terms of Reference on the Ministry of Health Official Main website that will be provided through the link:

- In-service curriculum content development (Pediatrics, Obstetrics, critical care and emotional intelligence-customer service)
- Identifying learning approaches to be used for the in-service training
- Working in collaboration with LBNM and the Nursing and Midwifery division of the MoH to adapt international best practices and content used by various stakeholders and come up with a standardized in-service curriculum covering the identified areas (Pediatrics, Obstetrics and critical care)
- Creating pre and post-test quizzes and cases scenarios to support the content
- Provide guidance on administration of training (facilitation)
- Finalization of the training package complete with participant handbook, workbook, and facilitator guide
- Create a roadmap for the implementation of the in-service training curricula which will be developed
- Prepare and facilitate the validation workshop with stakeholders (Government, partners, and civil society).
- Develop a protocol and plan to evaluate the roll out and effectiveness of the in-service training program

Reporting and Time Schedules: The assignment is for a period of two (2) months.
