The Symposium will facilitate the exchange of best practices for developing and sustaining community health programs, which will make achieving Universal Health Coverage practicable (UHC).

This historic and important event will bring together health practitioners and policymakers from Africa, Asia, Europe, Haiti, and America for a week. It is made possible with support from various partners, including UNICEF, USAID, Last Mile, Partners in Health Liberia, LLC, etc.

Annex 1: GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- 1. Proposal should be written in English and valid for a period of 90 days.
- 2. Ensure that your proposal reaches the addresses above on or before the deadline. Proposals that are delivered after the deadline for whatever reasons, shall not be considered.
- 3. The proposal that complies with all the requirements, meets all the evaluation criteria and offers value for money shall be selected and awarded the contract.
- 4. Any offer that does not meet the criteria shall be rejected.
- 5. Any discrepancies between the unit price and the total price shall be recomputed by the Ministry and the recomputed unit price and total shall prevail. If the vendor refuses the recomputed prices, the proposal shall be rejected.
- 6. No price variation due to escalation, inflation, fluctuation in exchange rates, or any other market factors shall be considered by the Ministry after it has received the proposal. At the time of the award of the contract, the Ministry reserves the right to vary the quantity (decrease or increase) services by a maximum of 25% of the total offer without change in the unit price or other terms and conditions.
- 7. Any offer or contract that will be made as a result of the RFP shall be subject to these general terms and conditions. The mere submission of a proposal implies that the vendor accepts without question these General Terms and conditions in Annex 1.
- 8. The Ministry and or its partners shall not be responsible for nor bound to award any contract or responsible for any costs incurred by the vendor in the preparation and submission of the proposal regardless of the outcome of the selection process.
- 9. The Ministry and its partners encourage every vendor to prevent and avoid conflict of interest by disclosing to the Ministry if the vendor or any of its affiliates or personnel were involved in the preparation of the requirements, design, cost estimates, and any other information used in this RFP.
- 10. The Ministry and its partners have zero tolerance for fraud, and other proscribed practices and are committed to identifying, preventing, and addressing all such acts and practices in the procurement of goods and services. The Ministry and her partners agree to bring allegations of corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive or obstructive practices arising in relation to this Agreement, of which any party has been informed or has otherwise become aware, promptly to the attention of the other party.
